Jacksonville Independent School District Board of Trustees Regular Meeting May 17, 2010

The Board of Education of the Jacksonville Independent School District, State of Texas, met for a Regular Meeting on May 17, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. in the Little Theater of the Jacksonville Middle School located at 1541 Pine Street in Jacksonville, Texas.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Board President, James Houser, announced that a quorum was present, that the meeting was duly called, and that notice of the meeting had been posted for the time and in the manner as required by law.

2. CANVASS MAY 8, 2010 SCHOOL BOARD ELECTION RESULTS

Mr. Houser asked two board members, Jimmy Brown and Todd Travis, to open the election envelope and canvass the May 8, 2010 JISD School Board Election results. Messrs. Brown and Travis verified that the Return Sheet and Tally Sheet reflected the following results:

Notary Public, Connie Pope, administered the Oath of Office to re-elected trustee Jim Tarrant, Jr. and to newly elected trustee Blaine Verhelle.

Mr. Houser presented a plaque to exiting trustee, Pat McCown, reflecting his 12 years of service to the District and thanked him for his dedication and devotion to the students of JISD. Mr. McCown was given a standing ovation by the board members and audience, addressed the group in attendance, and then relinquished his seat at the board table. Blaine Verhelle then took his place as a trustee at the board table.

5. RECOGNITION / AWARDS

A. TASB Media Honor Roll Awards

Mr. Houser presented two TASB Media Honor Roll Awards. One award was presented to the Jacksonville Daily Progress and the other award was presented to Nathan Straus, a reporter for the Jacksonville Daily Progress.

The TASB Media Honor Roll recognizes representatives in print, radio, television, and electronic media who (1) make the effort to get to know the superintendent, board president, and district's mission and goals; (2) report school news in a manner that is fair, accurate, and balanced; (3) give a high-profile position to good news about schools; (4) visit the schools; and (5) maintain a policy of no surprises by sharing information with school representatives.

B. "Texas Teacher of the Year" Program Nominees

B. Report on JHS Band Sweepstakes

JHS Band Director, Mike Bullock, introduced the drum majors and president of the JHS Band who were holding a large trophy signifying the 29th Sweepstakes (3rd consecutive) win for the JHS Varsity Band. This Sweepstakes win was the result of the Band receiving a "1" (superior) in all three UIL competitions for the 2009-10 school year.

Mr. Bullock also reported to the Board that:

- Nichols Intermediate 6th Grade Band won a 1st Division (superior) at Sandy Lake
- JMS 7th Grade Band received a 2 (excellent) for Concert and 1 (superior) for Sightreading
- JMS 8th Grade Band received a 2 (excellent) for Concert and 2 (excellent) for Sightreading
- JHS Concert Band received a 2 (excellent) for Concert and 2 (excellent) for Sightreading

- JHS Band Spring Concert is Thursday, May 20th, at 7:30pm in the JHS Auditorium
- Nichols and Middle School Spring Concert is Thursday, May 27th, at 6:30pm in the JHS Auditorium

Mr. Bullock also thanked Dr. Wardell, Judy Terry, and Tammy Jones for attending various band competitions throughout the year. He concluded by emphasizing that 187 students have pre-enrolled for Band next year at the JHS campus and that there is currently no room to rehearse the full band. He stressed the critical need for a new band hall to accommodate over 500 students and 4 band directors and asked the Board to consider this when planning for facilities.

C. Non-Traditional Schools

Dr. Wardell announced that the District has been approached by a group of parents asking JISD to look at the possibility of opening a non-traditional campus. He introduced JISD parent, Randy McCown, who addressed the Board. Mr. McCown reported that the group of parents has organized several meetings and that Dr. Wardell and Judy Terry have attended most of those meetings. He thanked Dr. Wardell for investigating a non-traditional school and for setting up tours to visit non-traditional campuses in other districts.

D. Special Education Department Annual Report

Dr. Leslie George presented a Special Education Department update to the Board highlighting how the District has performed in meeting state and federal standards in testing and program requirements:

- JISD met standard on 14 target indicators in State Performance Plan compared to state average of 10
- above standards included proficiency in both math and reading
- PBMAS (Performance Based Monitoring Analysis System): JISD met standard or low risk for 20 indicators, medium risk for 2 indicators, and high risk for 1 indicator out of 23 indicators reported

E. Discussion of JMS Weight Room Project

It was discussed that bids will be opened on May 21st for the JMS Weight Room Project that the board will consider and approve the bids at the regular June board meeting to be held June 21, 2010.

F. Discussion of FDA(LOCAL) Policy:

Dr. Wardell reminded the Board that they wanted to revisit the proposed FDA(LOCAL) policy discussed at the April board meeting. The current policy allows incoming transfers only if a parent/guardian is an employee of the District. This proposed policy change would allow JISD to accept any incoming student transfers on a case-by-case basis per the Superintendent's approval. The Board indicated that they would like to take action on the proposed policy at the June board meeting.

G. May 25, 2010 Special Board Meeting – Board Tour of Campuses

It was decided that this Special Board Meeting to tour the campuses should be scheduled for another day due to conflicts in some board members' schedules.
